## Structure, Governance and Management

**Governing Document** 

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Quoad Omnia Constitution.

**Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees** 

Members of the Kirk Session are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery.

**Organisational Structure** 

The Kirk Session which meets a minimum of nine times a year is responsible for all matters within the church

**Objectives and Activities** 

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond. New Monkland Parish Church holds one service on Sunday mornings at 10 am. There is a Sunday School and Bible Class, Boys Brigade and Guides. The Guild meets fortnightly and an outreach cafe takes place weekly on Wednesdays in the Church Hall. The local toddler group meets twice per week and the AA meets weekly in the Church Hall. An annual Fayre is held and a variety of social events take place throughout the year.

Our faithful, diligent, committed, united and talented Kirk Session continue to seek new ways to serve our people and our parish. Our congregation is involved in every aspect of village life and it is to their eternal credit that their involvement in this community is sought, respected and valued.

Our buildings, through the loving and diligent care of the Trustees, are in very good order and, through investment, will be kept fit for purpose for the next generation. We recognise and thank the Local Authority for the repair and replacement of the main flight of stairs at the entrance to our historic Kirk. Very grateful thanks are also conveyed to all who help to fund, maintain and clean our historic Auld Grey Kirk and Hall, your contribution is greatly appreciated. Likewise, our Cafe Crew and Cafe Committee work to make sure that our Outreach Cafe serves the needs of our people. Our Social Committee worked so hard and creatively through the year and it was extremely satisfying to see their hard work so greatly supported and richly rewarded - likewise the hard work of the Christmas Fayre Committee.

Life never stands still, and where children, young and/or vulnerable people are concerned, life moves ever more quickly. So, grateful thanks to another Trustee, Mrs Margaret Carmichael, our Safe-Guarding Officer who so diligently oversees our robust protection policies. Grateful thanks are extended to our Sunday School Leaders and helpers for their committed and excellent work – they are an inspiration to us all.

Recognition must also be given to our excellent youth and uniformed organisations who are arguably the best leaders of such groups in Scotland. New Monkland Parish Church is greatly blessed in its very good relationships with the local school and all of its Church organisations and youth groups who, throughout the year, contribute to various forms of inclusive and progressive worship.

It's a privilege to recognize the work of our Church Officer, Mr. John Paterson, our Session Clerk, Mrs. Margaret Millar and our Treasurer, Mr. Derek Croall.

Of course, none of our mission, service or worship would be possible without you and your constant gracious and generous support.

I invite you to take some time to read through these pages and intentionally rejoice, reflect and remember God's goodness to us. May we all be encouraged enabled, exhorted and enthused as we continue on this journey together.

As ever, the year ahead presents interesting and diverse challenges and exciting opportunities for mission, worship and service in our marvellous and historic Auld Grey Kirk on the Hill.

#### **Financial Review**

The principal source of income remains regular giving and associated tax recovered under Gift Aid.

The total offerings figure of £52,154, excluding tax recovered, shows an increase of £1,466 on the previous year's £50,688.

Gift Aid Tax recovered from HMRC in respect of the calendar year 2016 was £8,592, an increase of £798 on the previous year and again we thank Margaret Blades for her work in this regard.

Promotion of the Church of Scotland's National Stewardship Campaign and of the benefits of the Gift Aid scheme will continue in 2018.

The annual Christmas Fayre was held again in November and after several years of declining revenue, raised an astonishing £3,063.98, well up on the £1,855 raised in 2016 and the highest figure since 2013.

We were also able to raise funds for good causes during that period; Carol Singing raised £252.15 for Scripture Union and Christian Aid's Rohingya Appeal benefited from £477.73 raised during the Carols by Candle-light service.

Earlier in the year, Christian Aid's East Africa Famine Appeal raised £368 and our Harvest Appeal raised a further £302.79 for Christian Aid.

Income from the weekly outreach café increased considerably from £5,959 in 2016 to £6,485 in 2017. Thanks go to all those who have worked in, or contributed to the café.

The patio at the manse was in a dangerous condition and had to be repaired at a cost of £1,220. Roof repairs to the manse cost a further £520. All of this work was paid from the Fabric Fund.

Essential repairs were carried out to the hall roof in order to make it wind and watertight. The cost for this was £5,800 and was paid from the Fabric Fund. A further £385 was spent on guttering repairs and maintenance.

£216 has been spent on Heras Fencing to protect the public from the unsafe wall at the dwelling house to the east of the hall.

The boiler in the Church was repaired at a cost of £1,097.91 and refurbishment of the vestry cost

Heating and lighting costs for the year are slightly below budget.

Ministries and Mission Allocation for 2017 of £37,473 has been paid in full by standing order. The allocation for 2018 will be £39,213 – an increase of £1,740 on 2017.

Presbytery dues for 2018 are £1,002 compared to £914 in 2017.

Other significant costs during the year were:

£514 to Vincent Coyle for repairs and maintenance of the manse boiler and central heating and £819.78 to Vincent Coyle for repairs and maintenance of the cooker and boiler in the Church hall. A contract has now been arranged with Saltire Facilities Management for maintenance of both of these boilers and heating systems.

£468 for hall cleaning.

It has been decided that the Fabric Fund should remain at £10,000 and a transfer has been made from the general fund to reinstate this figure.

Overall, total fund balances increased by £1,553 to £131,907. Whilst this compares poorly with the 2016 surplus of £7,507, it should be noted that building repairs and maintenance for the year totalled £12,583 against last year's £5,793 – an increase of £6,790.

RBS continue to operate as our principle bankers. The Airdrie Branch of RBS will close in May 2018 and operation of our account will transfer to Coatbridge, however there will be no change to our account details.

Our current account with the Bank of Scotland remains active.

Finally, I would like to thank Mrs Wendy Ward who has agreed once again to carry out the independent examination of these accounts. Her willingness to carry out this essential role is greatly appreciated.

## **Reserves Policy**

At the year - end the total of unrestricted designated cash funds was £126,556. Due to the age of the church building it is difficult to assess the level of reserves which require to be held. In common with most other churches, our reserves are dictated by the level of expenditure in any given year against income from freewill offerings and fundraising.

The General Fund balance of £111,608 is consistent with the Trustees stated policy that the General Fund balance should be sufficient to reasonably allow for any unforeseen expenditure.

The Fabric Fund has been maintained at £10,000 to allow for ongoing upgrade to the manse.

We are not aware of any major repairs likely to be required to the Organ in the coming year, and consequently no provision has been made.

The Social Fund sits at £353 and the Youth Fund remains at £251.

No payments were made from the Benevolent Fund which remains at £1,793.

The Guild, Sunday School, Bible Class and Missionary Partner each have their own funds to enable them to fulfil their responsibilities.

The Church also holds £5,352 of restricted funds to be used for the maintenance of specific graves.

# **Statement of Trustees Responsibilities**

The members of the Kirk Session must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year. The members of the Kirk Session are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

#### Basis of independent examiner's statement
